Patna University has always been dedicated to sensitizing studentsto socially, professionally, and ethically relevant issues fortheir holistic development. Over the years, it has introducedseveral selffinancing programmes which centre on the topics ofgender sensitization, environment, human values and skilldevelopment. Syllabus revision has also been undertaken from timeto time to integrate value-added courses across differentprogrammes. Subjects like gender sensitization, environmentsustainability, human values and professional ethics were includedas core units in all four semesters of all post-graduationprogrammes. In the new CBCS syllabus introduced in 2018, theAbility Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) included thesubjects of gender sensitization, environment sustainability, human values and professional ethics. The different programmes within the streams of Humanities and Social Sciences have courses which deal with the environment, genderissues, human values and ethics.A separate Gender Sensitization Cell has also been constituted ata centralised level in the University to deal with gender-sensitiveissues and to instil the value of gender equity amongthe students. In order to sensitize students about environmental andsustainability issues, several academic activities like seminars, workshops, guest lectures and field excursions are organized forstudents at regular intervals.

Students can join any industry/ advanced laboratory /MNC etc. for an internship in the 4th semester. Project work, assignments, quizzes, presentations, etc. are integral parts of CIA in all programs. Student-centric methods adopted by departments to provide experiential and Participative Learning experiences are laboratory practical classes in Science departments etc; different types of surveys, presentation of Survey Reports by students, engaging students in Fieldwork and Public Awareness programmes, teaching assignments, Internship Programme, camps, Participation of students in Seminars, Conferences, study tours, etc. Problem-solving Methods include Trial and Error, breaking large tasks into small tasks, etc. through activities like research projects, leadership training, etc.

In the year 2021-22, during lockdown, classes were organised online by all Departments of the University. The University has in place

several ICT-enabled tools which are used by teachers for effective teaching and learning. A Computer Laboratory with 40 computers, Smart Class Room, Video Conferencing Room/ ContentDevelopment Unit is in place at Patna University Computer Centre. Patna University Computer Centre has a Library in its building. All books from the Patna University library are being enlisted on e-granthalaya on the NIC portal. The catalogue of books is available on e-granthalay. PhD CourseWork, MAWS Courses on Computer Education, Spoken-Tutorial and IT Skill Development Courses for various faculties are conducted regularly at Patna University Computer Centre. There is a facility for SWAYAM classes. Training, Workshops, Webinar and video Conferencing sessions are regularly organised. Departments like Botany, Geology, Physics, Geography etc have computer laboratories.ICT tools available and used: Video Conferencing system, Wi-fi, e-libraryLaptop, Projector (K-Yan), Android, PowerPointPresentation, Smart Board, Overhead Projector, LCD Projector, Slide Projector, E-books, E-theses & Dissertations, Ecopies of Journals. - Patna University has made radical changes in the examination in the last decade. It changed from the Annual Mode of Examination to Semester System in 2012. The Semester system is followed in Post Graduate Examination.
- 2. Choice-based Credit System was adopted in the AcademicSession 2018-19. The Letter Grade system of evaluation and CGPA has been introduced. In order to provide for the mobility of students from Patna University to another academic institution in India and abroad, 100 credits of the 10-hour duration of each credit have been adopted and implemented on 29 May 2018.
- 3. The Examination Section has switched over from manual preparation of results to computerized tabulation and publication of results.
- 4. Right to Public Service Act-2011 has been implemented in the Examination Section.
- 5. Patna University made radical changes in Ph. D. program in the last five years. It strictly follows the UGC regulations.
- 6. Right to Information Act, 2005 has been implemented in the Examination Section.
- 7. The Examination Section is steadily moving towards integrating all pre-examination and post-examination work through UMIS. The University has signed the MoU with NSDL for uploading the students' data to National AcademicDepository.

The University is very cognizant in generating waste. Waste generated is recycled by passing through a system that enables the material to be reused. This ensures that less natural resources are spent.

Moreover, the waste is segregated at each level and source, and is collected at designated time intervals. The waste is compiled in the dustbins (Green and Blue) provided at various places. The dustbins are emptied in movable containers/dustbins and is taken to the dumping yard provided by the University. The University has authorized vendor who collects the waste from the designated place, segregate them, recycles them and disposes them at the landfills authorized by the government.

Organic waste generated from places like canteen is recycled and used as organic manure. Trimmed grasses are used as direct green fertilizer.

Students in few departments are taught 'Solid waste management' as their DSE paper.

Waste water lines from toilets and bathrooms are connected with municipal drainage mains.

The University is very cognizant in generating waste. Waste generated is recycled by passing through a system that enables the material to be reused. This ensures that less natural resources are spent.

Moreover, the waste is segregated at each level and source, and is collected at designated time intervals. The waste is compiled in the dustbins (Green and Blue) provided at various places. The dustbins are emptied in movable containers/dustbins and is taken to the dumping yard provided by the University. The University has authorized vendor who collects the waste from the designated place, segregate them, recycles them and disposes them at the landfills authorized by the government.

Organic waste generated from places like canteen is recycled and used as organic manure. Trimmed grasses are used as direct green fertilizer.

Students in few departments are taught 'Solid waste management' as their DSE paper.

Waste water lines from toilets and bathrooms are connected with municipal drainage mains.

Waste generated by electronic equipments such as Computers, Phones, Printers, Fax and Photocopy machines are recycled properly. Non working switches, electric cables etc are stored and discarded properly. Efforts are made to reduce the generation of e waste as much as possible.

Eco friendly Campus:

The University has various initiatives for anEco-Friendly campus, like -

- Conservation of National Aquatic animal "Gangetic Dolphin". The researchers have created awareness through education and interaction among fishermen, students, policymakers, and administrators besides general public through different modules.
- 2. University has embarked on a plantation drive spread over 100 acres of its campus including its Saidpur Campus. The campus has green landscaping of plants which covers around 25 percent of the area. The variegated cropping of more than 2500 plants has established us as an eco-friendly campus. In few departments, herbal gardens are also present. Students also participate in campaigns like Plantation Drive, Conserve native species etc.
- 3. Rooftop solar photovoltaic power projects help in conservation of non- renewable energy.
- 4. The University has four solid waste disposal facilities in various parts of the campus for the disposal of organic wastes. It is segregated from non-recyclable and inorganic waste. This allows University to make use of organic waste to create compost, which gets utilized for the plantations. The University is planning to use this for revenue generation.
- 5. Compulsory courses on Environment sustainability and Swacch Bharat Abhiyan in Semester I of all Post Graduate programs helps students to understand the importance of environment in a better way.

Integrated structure: Patna University is a Teaching University. It is not an affiliating University. It has integrated structure in undergraduate and post-graduate teaching. College teachers are promoted as Professors and, even become Dean of various Faculties. They also supervise Ph. D. scholars. The students of colleges therefore get the benefit of being taught by a wide range of teachers. We work as cohesive unit in all areas of sports, cultural and other social activities.

Free Education to women: Our thrust is on free women's education to enhance the participation of women in higher education.

Enhancement in employment generation: Our priority is to run employment generating self-financing Programmes (like Master of Business Administration, Master of Computer Application, MA(Personnel Management and Industrial Relations), MSc(Biotechnology), MSc(Environmental Science), Master of Journalism and Mass Communication, MA(Rural Studies, Rural Management and Development), MA(Women's Studies), PG Diploma in Clinical Psychology, Master of Library Information Science, PG Diploma in Industrial Safety Management etc.) for producing employable human resource in specific fields. They not only provide knowledge and skill for employment but also create capacity for self-employment.

7.3.2 - Plan of action for the next academic year

1. To provide seed money to the faculty members of the University after due consideration of the research project proposal submitted by them. For this, a separate cell called "Research and Development Cell" has already been constituted.

2. To provide fellowship to the non-NET PhD research scholars for pursuing their research in regular mode.

3. To promote ICT enabled teaching in all departments by providing them high speed internet connections through fibre optics to be installed by ERNET, India as an initiative of Government of India. The work has already started.

4. To update Patna University website in a manner such that all research related data like publications, registered candidates etc are available easily on it.
