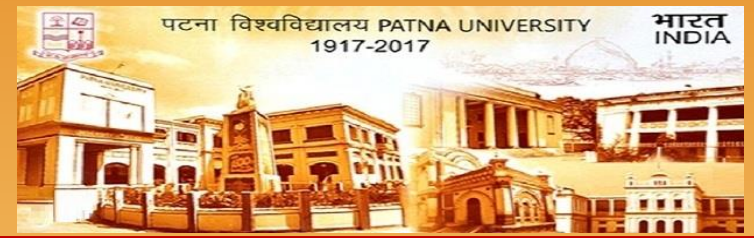

चौथी सूची के अनुसार नामांकन पूरा, 400 सीटें अब भी खाली

पटना विश्वविद्यालय में मंगलवार को चौथी मेधा सूची के अनुसार नामांकन की प्रक्रिया समाप्त हो गयी। सामान्य और वोकेशनल कोर्स मिलकर करीब 400 सीटें खाली हैं जिसके लिए नामांकन स्पॉट राउंड के तहत ली जाएगी। स्पॉट राउंड नामांकन ऑनलाइन लिए जाने का संभावना है। बता दें कि पहली मेरिट लिस्ट के अनुसार 3 हजार से अधिक छात्रों ने सामान्य और वोकेशनल कोर्स में एडमिशन लिया है। दूसरी मेरिट लिस्ट में 4 सौ अधिक

छात्रों ने दोनों कोर्सों में नामांकन कराया है। तीसरी मेरिट लिस्ट में 3 सौ से ज्यादा छात्रों ने नामांकन कराया है। चौथी मेरिट लिस्ट के अनुसार बीएन कॉलेज में 13, माध महिला कॉलेज में 3, साइंस कॉलेज में 2 और पटना कॉलेज में 9 यानी कुल मिलाकर करीब 30 छात्रों ने नामांकन कराया है। वहीं चौथी मेरिट लिस्ट में कुल मिलाकर 86 छात्रों ने नामांकन कराया है। छात्र कल्याण संकायव्यवस्था डॉ. अनिल कुमार ने कहा चौथी मेरिट लिस्ट के तहत खाली सीटों पर स्पॉट राउंड के तहत नामांकन लिया जाएगा। स्पॉट राउंड में पहली, दूसरी, तीसरी और चौथी मेरिट लिस्ट के तहत जो छात्र नामांकन नहीं ले पाए हैं वह छात्र भी स्पॉट राउंड में नामांकन करा सकते हैं।

Patna University launches two refresher courses for teachers

PATNA: The Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC) of Patna University (PU) on Monday kicked off two refresher courses for the newly appointed teachers of different colleges and universities in the state. While one course is meant for teachers of Maithili, the other one is a short-term course on gender sensitization. Inaugurating the Maithili refresher course, former head of PU Maithili department

Indra Kant Jha regretted that despite its rich culture and literature the subject of Maithili is not attracting the modern youths. He said that with the inclusion of Maithili in the 8th schedule of Indian Constitution, the subject may be offered by students aspiring for Civil Services examinations conducted by the UPSC or BPSC.

Jha traced the history of the valuable contribution of subject teachers in the academic growth of PU and expressed the hope that the refresher course would enrich the knowledge of teachers in the subject. He called upon the participants to motivate the students to take interest in literary activities and serve the cause of Maithili.

PU humanities' faculty dean Tarun Kumar eulogized the glorious culture of Mithila and the richness of Maithili language and literature. He stressed the need of preserving the folk art and literature of Mithila.

PU students' welfare dean Anil Kumar and Patna Science College principal Raj Kishore Prasad also expressed their views on the subject. HRDC director Atul Aditya Pandey said that altogether 43 teachers from different colleges will be attending the refresher course till September 3. Course coordinator Aruna Chaudhary welcomed the participants and outlined the significance of the refresher course. The short-term online refresher course on gender sensitization was inaugurated by PU pro-vice-chancellor Ajay Kumar Singh.

Patna: 'B R Ambedkar's thoughts still relevant'

PATNA: Head of Patna University (PU) political science department Binay Soren said here on Tuesday that the thoughts of B R Ambedkar were becoming more and more relevant with the passage of time. Many of the anxieties insightfully articulated by Ambedkar remain as significant as ever since the Constitution of India was adopted 72 years ago, he said.

Delivering the Ambedkar memorial lecture organized by PU Ambedkar Chair at Darbhanga House here, Soren said Ambedkar had rightly asserted that a society without fraternity, equality, and liberty would be no deeper than coats of paints. His thoughts are all well expressed in the Preamble of the Constitution, he said.

The Indian society is getting increasingly fragmented even as the nation is striving hard to become an economic superpower. In such times of obsession with economic growth, the state has an inherent responsibility to act as a countervailing force and mend the social fabric and ensure social development and economic growth travel in the same direction, he added. Ambedkar chair professor Seema Prasad presided. Rishika Raj conducted the programme and Hulesh Manjhi proposed the vote of thanks.

पीयू: फोर्थ मेरिट लिस्ट का नामांकन समाप्त, आज स्पॉट राउंड की घोषणा

पटना. पटना विश्वविद्यालय में फोर्थ मेरिट लिस्ट के अनुसार नामांकन समाप्त हो गया है. अंतिम दिन सिर्फ 35 नामांकन हुए, इसलिए अब स्पॉट राउंड के तहत नामांकन करने का निर्णय लिया गया है. स्पॉट राउंड में उन छात्रों के लिए नामांकन को ओपन कर दिया जाएगा, जिन्होंने भी नामांकन के लिए आवेदन किया है. जिन कॉलेजों में सीटें खाली हैं, वहां वे संपर्क कर नामांकन के लिए प्राचार्यों को आवेदन कर सकेंगे. इसके प्रक्रिया ऑनलाइन



होगी या ऑफलाइन इस पर बुधवार को नामांकन कमेटी निर्णय लेगी. स्टूडेंट्स वेलफेयर डीन प्रो अनिल कुमार ने कहा कि नामांकन प्रक्रिया को हर हाल में अगस्त में ही पूरा कर दिया जाएगा. 2 सितंबर से हर हाल में कक्षाएं प्रारंभ कर दी जाएंगी.

Coming soon at Patna University: Advanced research centre and international hostel

PATNA: Patna University (PU) is likely to have an advanced research centre along with an international hostel for its scholars soon. The construction of both these facilities is in progress, which may be commissioned in the next academic session (2023-24). PU development officer Parimal Kumar Khan said the Bihar State Educational Infrastructure Development Corporation (BSEIDC) has been constructing both these buildings as per approved plan. On completion, both these facilities would fulfil the long-felt needs of the 105-year-old university.

The advanced research centre is to be housed in a G+2 block being constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 8.5 crore opposite the physics department inside Patna Science College premises. The first floor of this block would house the Data Centre. The centre would have all the modern, sophisticated instruments required by the scholars of science faculty.

The state government and the department of science and technology (DST) of the Union government have been approached for funds for the purchase of necessary instruments. In fact, the centre is also supposed to serve as a centralized instrumentation centre to be used by the scholars and faculties of all the universities and colleges in the state. Scholars from other institutions of higher education would be required to pay a nominal charge for using the instruments at the centre. This centre would have laboratories, conference halls, faculty rooms, store, and cafeteria. The Rashtriya Uchcharat Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) has already sanctioned a grant of Rs 3.5 crore for the purchase of instruments at the centre, Khan said.

The international hostel is being constructed in an area of 15,742 sq.ft. at an estimated cost of Rs 4 crore (sanctioned by the state higher education council under Rashtriya Uchcharat Shiksha Abhiyan). The hostel would have a G+3 structure with a common room and dining hall on the ground floor and 24 rooms on the upper three floors. All the rooms would have attached toilets and kitchens and would be fully furnished, Khan added.

The state government has also sanctioned funds for the construction of new academic and administrative buildings of PU. A multi-storied (G+11) academic block would be constructed at a cost of Rs 88 crore and a new multi-storied (G+9) administrative block would be constructed at a cost of Rs 58 crore.

Both these blocks, Khan said, would be constructed by BSEIDC in an area of about five acres lying between the present VC lodge at Patna College and Krishna Ghat. The new administrative block would replace the existing office of PU which fails to meet all its present-day requirements. The old building, which happens to be of heritage importance, would accommodate the newly-started vocational courses.

The new administrative block would house offices of all the deans, placement cell, IT cell, evaluation centre and auditorium besides the main office of the university. The new academic block will accommodate all the post-graduate departments of social sciences and humanities, which are all presently located in the congested Darbhanga House complex. The Darbhanga House complex would then accommodate Vanija Mahavidyalaya (presently located within Patna College premises) and the post-graduate department of applied economics and commerce. In due course, the commerce wing of PU would be shifted to its own spacious campus at Saidpur complex, he said
